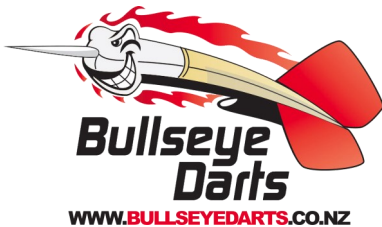

In the Quarter Final's a gallant Orewa side prevailed over Manly needing 2 extra ends to eventually win (22-19) through to the Semi Finals. Both Birkenhead sides had comfortable wins (25-15 & 21-13) and Warkworth (who were unbeaten in Section Play) overcame Beach Haven (25-21) to also progress to the Semi Finals.
In a thrilling Semi Final between Orewa and Birkenhead Bees, it was Orewa who jumped out to a massive lead 15-1, however the Bees never gave in and clawed their way back to be leading by a single shot playing the last end and looked like that it could be an all Birkenhead Final. Orewa picked up 2 Bonus Points in the last end and both sides traded blows before Orewa secured the win (24-22) and a place in the Final. In the other Semi Final it was the Stingers from Birkenhead that prevailed over Warkworth (25-19).
The Final was a very one sided affair and Birkenhead never recovered from a slow start to eventually be convincingly well beaten by an outstanding Orewa Team (36-4).

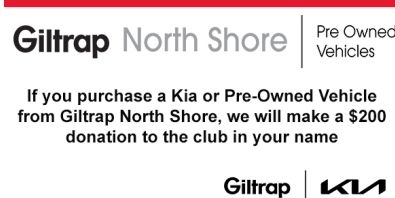
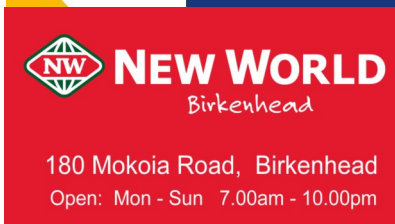
Tilting...
