

Back-to-back Birkenhead blockbusters

ebruary proved to be a most tumultuous time for most parts of New Zealand's North Island, with widespread flooding and Cyclone Gabrielle hitting regions hard.

Of course, the well-known North
Harbour Centre was no exception though not even the brute force of
mother nature could hold down the
prestigious Birkenhead pairs events with both the men's and women's
flagship instalments going ahead as
planned.

First up was the men's open pairs competition, with the annual classic proving a drawcard for high performers, littered with stars, including past, current and future internationals, as well as some of the best players on the local scene.

After four rounds of section play, the 32 combinations were whittled down to the top 16, with the remaining 16 teams dropping down to a Plate Section. Following three rounds of exciting knockout rounds, only two

teams remained in the Champions
Cup draw - both pairings unbeaten
to this point, snagging seven wins
each and setting up a thrilling final
on the Birkenhead green.

Getting out of the blocks early,
Auckland composite Bart Robertson
and Steve Hoeft took a 9-6 lead
opposite New Zealand Blackjack
representative Tony Grantham and
Takapuna lead Jerry Belcher, though
a quick turn of play saw Grantham
secure seven unanswered shots over

the next two ends to lead, 13-9.

Despite a spirited attempt to get back in the final, Grantham and Belcher held on for the win, 14-13, giving Grantham his third win in this event and Belcher his first.

Both Grantham and Belcher were congratulated on their efforts and awarded a \$1500 winners' cheque.

In other results, former New Zealand international Jamie Hill and Mark Burgess took out the Champions Cup A flight opposite Mike Bradshaw and Kevin Morris, while Sean Hird and Adam Wishnoski secured the Consolation spoils.

Meanwhile, one week later, the women's edition saw the Takapuna powerhouse of Lisa Dickson and Lauren Mills romp to the spoils, rewarded for their efforts in section play on day one following an early halt in play, due to incoming weather conditions.

With the weather forecast to take a turn for the worst, the decision was made to cut the tournament short by one day - enabling those travelling north and south to get away early and home safely - in hindsight, a genius move given the onslaught of horrific weather that followed.

Prizes were awarded on the results from Saturday's play. Mills and Dickson were declared the tournament winners, taking away the
